Wales Monthly Update

2 January 2025

Happy New Year! The start of another year is here and rest assured, we have plenty of plans in motion for the coming year to ensure it's another busy one! Keep yourself up-to-date with our latest Wales Monthly Update, here to ensure you stay in the loop, providing an overview of our December activities, as well as looking ahead to all our events kicking off 2025.

Campaigning and Policy Activity

The Draft Budget for 2025/26, published on December 10, included several key FSB asks, including the extension of the 40% rates relief for retail, leisure and hospitality businesses, as well as capping the multiplier used to calculate rates will be capped at 1% for 2025-26.

Elsewhere in the Draft Budget, Welsh Government confirmed capital funding for maintaining Welsh roads - another of FSB's calls. Poorly-maintained roads are a huge challenge to FSB members, impact on the ability to grow and attract investment to our communities and so we're pleased to see Welsh Government commit additional funding to this. We similarly welcomed the decision to allocate resource to freeing up the planning system in Wales - another constraint on economic growth. Following the Draft Budget announcement, FSB representatives were interviewed across Welsh media talking about the impact of Welsh Government's measures. The true test of the Budget will, of course, be whether it ends Wales' prolonged period of economic stagnation and FSB have urged the Welsh Government to work with small businesses to develop a long-term economic delivery plan.

FSB joined other leading representatives and partners from Welsh Business and beyond at the inaugural meeting of the Wales Economic Forum with Welsh Government Minister for Economy, Energy and Planning Rebecca Evans MS. The Forum, hosted by Business News Wales at the Senedd discussed the current business landscape and some of the priorities and opportunities for the coming year including Welsh Government's Investment Summit in 2025 and showcasing Welsh business. As part of the Senedd Economy, Trade and Rural Affairs Committee's Inquiry into AI and the Welsh Economy, FSB Deputy Head of Policy Felix Millbank gave evidence on behalf of FSB. During the session, Felix outlined some of the opportunities posed by AI for Welsh smaller businesses and productivity as well as some of the support needed to

help them exploit new technology. You can watch a recording of the session <u>here</u>. We have also provided evidence to the Senedd on Wales' International Strategy.

Throughout December, FSB ran a #10PoundPledge campaign, encouraging people across Wales to commit to spending at least £10 locally with a small business and to share on social media what makes that business special. We've been pleased to see individuals including politicians post videos telling us about some great local businesses, supporting the town centre spaces we want to see and preserving the heart and soul of our communities.

FSB Wales' Policy Chair, Ben Francis, joined the inaugural meeting of Welsh Economic the Growth Advisory Group, established by the Secretary of State for Wales. The purpose of the to discuss group is opportunities to drive growth and prosperity for Wales. Ben championed



the voice of small businesses and urged the UK and Welsh governments to work together to outlie how Wales and our small businesses will feature in their growth missions. He emphasised that the Industrial Strategy must help deliver and complement the investment we need in key growth enablers, including our transport networks and business support structures.
