WHAT IS THE GRAN FONDO?

Gran Fondo (which translates as Big Race) is a longdistance mass participation event that celebrates competitive cycling for everyone, not just the professionals.

The top 25% of riders from 27 qualifying events held around the world have been invited to compete in Scotland.

Yes, Gran Fondo is about inclusion and community. But make no mistake: between the start and finish line, it's seriously competitive. The stakes will be high, the battles will be intense, and the times will be quick.





The Gran Fondo Races

In both the Time Trials and mass-start Road Races, Gran Fondo riders of varying ages and abilities take on beautiful but challenging courses. The seriously-fast cyclists will be competing for medals, while everyone else is hoping to beat their personal best.

Traditionally, a huge feast follows the finish line at these events. With Scottish hospitality being what it is, there'll no doubt be a big party!

Gran Fondo events are unticketed and free to spectate at start and finish locations and along the routes.





GETTING TO THE GRAN FONDO GENERAL TRAVEL INFORMATION

Hints & tips for your journey

Here's our top travel tips to get you to and around Perth and Dundee to enjoy the Gran Fondo events:

- There's no need to travel to the start or finish areas. Walk or cycle to your closest point to see more of the action.
- Road closures will be in place along the route. Walk or cycle to the route for the easiest way to catch the action.
- Driving will be difficult with road closures and limited parking. If you can, leave the car at home and walk, cycle or use public transport.
- If you do need to drive, park responsibly. Do not park on race routes, in laybys or on road verges.
- Bus services will be impacted. Plan ahead and allow extra time for your journey.
- Remember to be responsible and watch the action from a safe location.

Camping and camper vanning

Please be aware that there is no provision for campervans in the area surrounding the Start and Finish locations and Event Villages of our Gran Fondo Events.

Please book a pitch on one of the many commercial campsites locally and travel by public transport.

To make sure you and others have the best possible experience, if you are considering camping or using a caravan during your trip - please read the Scottish Outdoor Access Code Guide to Responsible Camping in Scotland. Please book your campsite space in advance.

Please do not park on race routes, in laybys or on road verges.

ROUTES

If planning to watch the races along the route, be mindful that there may not be spectator facilities such as toilets available for you to use.

Stewarded pedestrian crossing points will be in operation to get across the route safely. Please heed advice and instructions from stewards and course officials and stay safe.

GETTING TO THE GRAN FONDOBE A CHAMPION SPECTATOR

Follow these handy tips for your visit:


- Be A Good Sport: We'd love to see your photos on social media - don't forget to tag #PowerOfTheBike and #GlasgowScotland2023!
 - Filming and photography must be for personal, noncommercial purposes only.
 - Flash photography and drones are prohibited.
 - When taking pictures, make sure to stay behind the course boundary and stay safe.
- If you're planning to watch the action along the route, please don't park on the race routes, in laybys or on road verges. Don't get in the way of the peloton or individual riders or take selfies as the race approaches or goes past you.
- **Be A Team Player:** When enjoying the race at the start and along the course, keep to the paths (where available), respect the local community and take your rubbish with you when you leave.
- Children: Always supervise children and keep them safe.
- **Dogs:** Keep dogs on leads. Although dogs can be brought to the route, only assistance dogs are permitted in enclosed areas of the Start and Finish venues.
- Don't impede the barriers or branding.

GATEWAY TO THE HIGHLANDS

Renowned Scottish writer Sir Walter Scott described Perthshire as "the fairest portion of the northern kingdom" and with some of Scotland's most magnificent lochs, forests, woodlands and glens, it's hard to argue with the great man.

A great race will take place here too as Perth & Kinross hosts the Gran Fondo Road Race.

Just one hour from Glasgow and Edinburgh, Perthshire is a great getaway for family-friendly days out and short breaks or adrenaline-fuelled outdoor activities.




Perth was Scotland's capital from the 9th century until the 15th

century.


Due to its location in the heart of the country, it's known as the Gateway to the Highlands - it's a great base to venture further north.

PERTH & KINROSS GETTING THERE (CONT.)

Bus

Perth is well served by intercity Citylink and Megabus services which call into Perth Bus Station on Leonard Street (what3words///define.kicked.scared) and at Broxden Services (what3words///crowds.scan.sweat). Local service buses, operated by Stagecoach, also connect the city to outlying towns and villages.

A public Park & Ride service (bus fares apply) is available at Broxden Services in Perth for onward travel into Perth City Centre. The site has free spaces for 400 cars and there is a waiting room with public toilets and a staffed information point here too.

Bear in mind, road closures for events may impact local bus routes, so please plan ahead.

Shuttle bus

A shuttle bus service will operate between Scone Palace and Perth for the Gran Fondo Road Race. This service is meant for spectators, supporters and other non-cycling entourage.

Perth is a short 10-minute bike ride from Scone Palace. Shuttle bus transfers will take approximately 10 minutes.

Walk, wheel & cycle

Cycling, wheeling and walking to the start area are great options to come and see the Road Race and there are public cycle parking facilities in Perth City Centre.

Please see the **Perth City cycling and walking map** for more information on routes in and around the city.

There are public cycle parking facilities in Perth City Centre. These are non-staffed/managed areas. Please remember to bring a lock to secure your bike. Please do not lock or chain your bike to fencing or barriers.

The finish area at Scone Palace is around 2 miles from the city centre and it is possible to cycle here, though bear in mind this will be along the busy A93.

PERTH & KINROSS GETTING THERE (CONT.)

Car

Driving may be difficult within Perth City Centre due to road closures and limited parking, so avoid using the car if you can. Please refer to Perth & Kinross Council's car parking guide for advice. You can also find more information on Perth & Kinross Council's website.

There will be no dedicated spectator parking in Perth for the Road Race and the city will also be very busy on Friday 4 August with Perth Agricultural Show taking place. On-street Pay & Display parking is likely to be very limited.

Please note there is limited Pay & Display parking available at Scone Palace. On 4 August, if you are intending to drive, you need to be parked by 11:00 and be aware that no car departures will be permitted until after 17:45. Regular shuttle buses will run between Perth and Scone Palace – please see Shuttle Buses section on page 16.

If you need to drive, please allow plenty of time for your journey and consider parking outside the city and completing your journey by public transport.

If you plan to watch the racing along the route outwith Perth, be aware of road closures and please park responsibly. Please don't park on the race routes, in laybys or on road verges. Don't get in the way of riders or take selfies as they approach and go past you.

Accessible parking

There is no dedicated Blue Badge parking for the Gran Fondo Road Race start in Perth. Please use existing public Blue Badge parking provision within the city where available. Parking in close proximity to the routes will be limited so consider if you need to drive. Make sure you comply with local parking regulations and be considerate of other road users.



PERTH & KINROSS START/FINISH VENUE

There are two venues for the Gran Fondo Road Race taking place in Perth:

Perth Event Village

This will be located at Perth Concert Hall on Wednesday 2 and Thursday 3 August and includes an Expo, official event merchandise and an information desk. As it's located in the heart of the city centre, there are many cafés, restaurants, shops and pubs to visit.

Finish Village

Scone Palace, around 3km from Perth Concert Hall, will host the finish and is open from 11:00 - 18:45 on Friday 4 August. Entry to the venue is free and open for all to attend.

A free shuttle bus service will run between Perth and Scone Palace. On site you'll find food vendors, an Expo, official event merchandise and after all the effort out on the road, this is where the magic happens, the battles are decided and the jerseys are awarded.

PERTH & KINROSS WHERE TO WATCH

- Perth City Centre: the Gran Fondo Road Races will start
 on Tay Street in this beautiful and ancient city, set on the
 banks of the River Tay. There are many cafés, restaurants,
 shops and pubs to visit and don't miss Perth Art Gallery,
 the Black Watch Castle & Museum and the North and South
 Inches two large and lovely parks near the city centre.
- Loch na Creige: on the climb before Aberfeldy, you'll find a picturesque spot known as Loch na Creige. Overlooked by the peaks of Monadh nam Mial and Craig Formal, this quiet loch is a hit among locals and visitors alike for fishing, paddle-boarding, wild swimming and walking routes.
- Tomphubil: this section of the route lies in the shadow of the mighty Munro of Schiehallion (meaning 'fairy hill of the Caledonians in Gaelic), so you can be assured of some magic! Offering a window into Scotland's ethereal wilderness and situated mid-way between Coshieville and Tummel Bridge, the Lime-kiln here is a great reference point for the Gran Fondo Road Race.
- Pitlochry: situated at the midpoint of the Gran Fondo,
 Pitlochry town centre is always worth a visit. Victorian
 architecture, historic distilleries and an array of unusual
 shops attract visitors to Highland Perthshire's largest town.
 The icing on the proverbial cake is Pitlochry's wide range
 of buzzing cafés and restaurants, where delicious local
 dishes, bags of character and incredible live music will
 leave you eager to plan your next trip.
- Blairgowrie & Rattray: sixteen miles from Perth, Blairgowrie and Rattray sits on the home stretch of the Gran Fondo. An historic market town on the banks of the River Ericht, Blairgowrie is known as the 'Gateway to Glenshee' and is an outdoor enthusiast's heaven. Golfing, mountain biking, abseiling, hang-gliding, paragliding and gorgeous hill walks ae on your doorstep here plus whisky and gin distilleries for a more relaxing option!

Why not stay in Tay Country a bit longer and explore more of this beautiful and fascinating corner of Scotland?

- Where to stay From friendly B&Bs to luxury hotels, there's no shortage of great places to stay in Perth & Kinross.
- Eating out From fine dining to light bites, Perth & Kinross has a great selection of eateries within the city and beyond.
- Other things to see and do The race will finish at Scone Palace, the original home of the Stone of Destiny. Also known as the Stone of Scone, this was the coronation site for Scottish kings before the Stone was taken to England in the 13th century, where it has been used in the coronation of monarchs since. Next year the Stone will return to Perth as the centrepiece of the new Perth Museum.

Visit Perth Art Gallery, which showcases some of the most influential Scottish artists of the 20th and 21st centuries.

The Black Watch Museum explores the history of Scotland's oldest regiment and is currently home to the giant Hauntings sculpture, which is free to view.

For whisky lovers, Perth and Kinross is also home to a host of world famous distilleries including Dewars, Edradour and Glenturret.


DISCOVERY AND EXPLORATION

Walk, wheel & cycle

Cycling and walking are great ways to explore Dundee. Dundee.com has information about cycling in and around the city and you'll also find Dundee Cycle Hub, offering bike hire, servicing and friendly advice, on the waterfront beside the V&A Dundee.

National Cycle Route 1 runs from the city centre out towards Broughty Ferry and the Michelin Scotland Innovation Parc is just 1.5 miles north of this route as you enter Broughty Ferry. An unmanned cycle parking area will be available on venue. Please remember to bring a lock to secure your bike.


Car

Free parking will be available on-site at the Michelin Scotland Innovation Parc which can be access via Beryl Street. You will need to download and present an access pass at the entrance to the Parc.

If you plan to watch the racing along the route outwith Dundee, be aware of road closures and please park responsibly. Please don't park on the race routes, in laybys or on road verges. Don't get in the way of riders or take selfies as they approach and go past you.

DUNDEE & ANGUS START/FINISH VENUE

There will be an event village as well as the start/finish venue for the Gran Fondo Individual Time Trial taking place in Dundee:

Dundee Event Village

Located at Michelin Scotland Innovation Parc, this venue will open from 15:00 to 18:00 on Sunday 6 August and 08:00 to 18:00 on Monday 7 August, and there are some great activities planned here:

- Join Dundee Dragons Wheelchair Sports and enjoy their adaptive cycle taster sessions.
- See live coverage of the Individual Time Trials or browse the Expo and official event merchandise.
- An information desk and toilets are available here and the medal ceremonies will take place at the Event Village.

Dundee start/finish venue

This is located at West Grange Roundabout and is open from 10:00 to 15:00. The start/finish is around 4.5km from Dundee Event Village and there's a spectator zone with toilets here too.

Come and enjoy the thrilling and fast-paced racing and see the funny helmets, strange handlebars and disc wheels that help give riders that aerodynamic edge.

EVENT SAFETY

BE PREPARED

- Stay hydrated, make sure you fill your water bottle before you leave home.
- Cycling is an all-weather sport and Scotland's temperate maritime climate means the weather can change quickly in one day. Remember to check the weather forecast before travelling and pack appropriate clothing and footwear.
- We also recommend that spectators bring sunscreen, sunglasses and non-aerosol insect repellent.

LEAVE AT HOME

A number of items are forbidden on site, including:

- glass bottles
- flares, fireworks or
 foam fingers or sparklers
- bang bang sticks
 - cardboard hands
- hand-waving flags
- balloons















EVENT SAFETY

KEEP EVERYONE SAFE

We have some top things to keep in mind so you, and others, can enjoy the races safely:



Routes will be marked with yellow advanced warning signs in the run up to the race. Please don't park on the route on the day: if necessary, vehicles may have to be removed.



There will be an advance vehicle 10 minutes ahead of the race, keeping you up to date with what is happening in the event.



Please keep children back from the edge of the road and animals on a lead, away from the roadside. Riders pass by very quickly, and while we encourage support, please keep flags, objects, and photography equipment out of the road.

Remember, taking selfies is fun, but turning your back on the race is never a good idea. Please face the oncoming riders and race convoy at all times.



The race is escorted along the route by trained police officers and escort motorcyclists. If you are asked to stop or move out of the way by an officer, please listen carefully and obey their instructions.


